Redbirds Revolving Door: Ken Boyer was dismissed as manager between games of a doubleheader in Montreal, June 8th, with the ballclub at 18-33. Coach Jack Krol (0-1) managed Game #2. "Whitey" Herzog was given the helm June 9th and compiled a 38-35 record before he was promoted to be the team's General Manager near the end of August. Coach and former manager "Red" Schoendienst finished the season as skipper. His record was 18-19...The Cardinals hit well enough to end the season first in the N. L. in batting average (.275); runs scored (738); hits (1,541); and doubles (300). They produced 101 home runs led by George Hendrick's 25. Keith Hernandez followed with 21. Hendrick had the most RBI (109); Hernandez was second with 99. "Mex" was the league leader with 111 runs scored and a .408 OBP...Pete Vukovich's 12 wins and 132 strikeouts paced the pitching staff. Bob Forsch was an 11-game winner. Cardinals hurlers collected the most complete games in the N. L. (34) but wound up the season a lowly 12th in ERA (3.93)...Herzog was named manager for 1981, directing the team on the field through mid-1990.
