For 15 days the White Sox were tied or had sole-possession of first place of the AL West. The last day was May 22nd...One-time White Sox star and fan-favorite, Minnie Minoso at age 54, became the first player since the Senators' Nick Altrock in 1933 to play in five decades. In two plate appearances, Minoso grounded out...Jim Morrison hit 15 homers, 40 doubles, and 171 base hits to lead the Sox's offense. Outfielder Wayne Nordhagen matched Morrison's home run number. Lamar Johnson and rookie Harold Baines, 21, both hit 13 jacks. Johnson led the ballclub with 81 RBI. As a team, Chicago clubbed 91 home runs and batted .259...Britt Burns was the pitching staff's biggest winner and strikeout leader with 15 and 133, respectively. Rich Dotson collected 12 victories. The staff ERA was 3.92, sixth in the A. L...Owner Bill Veeck put the franchise up for sale in 1979 and 1980. A deal with a group from Denver fell through as well as one with Ed DeBartolo, Sr. that was rejected by the league's other owners. Veeck eventually sold the team to the duo of Jerry Reinsdorf and Eddie Einhorn.
