"Sparky" Anderson's first full season as the Tigers manager started with some missing key components. During the off-season, centerfielder Ron LeFlore was traded north to Montreal for starting pitcher Dan Schatzeder. The likes of Aurelio Rodriguez, Jerry Morales, and "Rusty" Staub were moved as well. On May 27<sup>th</sup>, Jason Thompson went to the Angels in exchange for the new rightfielder, Al Cowens. Ricky Peters won LeFlore's vacant outfield job. Tom Brookens took over at third base and produced a fine season. In 151 games he hit 10 homers and drove home 66. With his right shoulder virtually dead, Mark Fidrych was able to contribute little after missing almost all of the '79 campaign. He was 2-3 in nine starts in 1980...At the All Star break, Detroit was in a good position to challenge for the AL East title (2<sup>nd</sup> place, 42-33 record, 7 1/2 games out) on the strength of a nine-game winning streak June 20<sup>th</sup> through the 28<sup>th</sup>. In the second half, they were 42-45 with a 17-17 final month...All Star Lance Parrish, 24, led the team with 24 jacks. He and Richie Hebner both knocked in 82 runs to finish second behind Steve Kemp's 101. Kemp popped 21 homers. The Tigers other All Star, Alan Trammell, 22, earned a Gold Glove and topped the ballclub with 168 base hits and 107 runs scored. Trammell's keystone mate, Lou Whitaker, 23, had an off-year (1 homer, 45 RBI). His defense was as exceptional as his prior seasons. Detroit hit .273 and 143 home runs. They led the A. L. with 830 runs scored...Jack Morris's 16 wins and 112 K's led the pitching corps. The staff ERA ended the year at 4.25.
