The Rangers experienced exactly what is called an "up-and-down" season: They ended April in third place (2 games out of first); May 31st they were fourth (5 games out); June 8th they were in fifth (9 games out); the All Star break found them third, once again (9 ½ out); they soon shot into second, but by then they were 10 ½ games in back of the AL West leader and would flip between third and fourth the rest of the year...Al Oliver (96 runs scored) led the team in RBI (117) and doubles (43), and tied Richie Zisk for the lead in homers (19). "Buddy" Bell swatted 17 home runs; Pat Putnam contributed 13. Bell, who received his second Gold Glove, was second to Oliver with 83 RBI. As a team, the Rangers hit better than in '79 (.284, second in the A. L.) but hit 16 fewer homers (124, 8th)...The pitching staff had a higher ERA (4.02) than the year before, but they struck out the most hitters in the league (890). "Doc" Medich's fourteen wins topped the staff while reliever Danny Darwin took home thirteen victories, Fergie Jenkins twelve, and Jon Matlack ten. Matlack was the staff leader with 142 strikeouts; he completed eight games. Jenkins completed 12 contests and punched out 129 batters...Mickey Rivers finished fourth in the majors in batting average, third in hits (210). "Bump" Wills scored 102 runs.
