Manager Darrell Johnson was fired August 3rd with a 39-65 record following a weekend sweep by the Tigers in Detroit. Johnson, a one-time skipper of the Red Sox who posted a .539 winning percentage in Boston, could muster only a 226-362 (.384) mark in Seattle. His Mariners ballclubs never finished a season above sixth place in the AL West. Maury Wills, who had previously campaigned for himself stating that he could take any last place team and win a World Championship within four years, got the job upon Johnson's dismissal. As it turned out, Wills proved not be very adept at in-game strategy and found a very wanting communicator with the players. He once exclaimed his top-notch second baseman, Julio Cruz, would be permanently moved to shortstop. When Cruz checked the line-up card the following day, he was back at second and remained there with no explanation. Seattle beat writers regularly got a chuckle with some of Wills' line-up juggling and in-game management. He lasted as the Mariners Captain until the first week of May in 1981... *Team Leaders:* Tom Paciorek (15 HR); Bruce Bochte [BOCK-tee] (78 RBI, 156 base hits); Glenn Abbott (12 wins); and Floyd Bannister (155 strikeouts)...The Mariners waded through a consecutive 12-game losing skein from late July into early August, most of it coming on Johnson's watch...Seattle ended the year 30-48 versus division opponents.
