After reaching the American League Championship Series in 1979, the Angels took a huge step back from contention in 1980. A host of injuries to key players largely ruined the season. For the entire campaign, The Halos bounced between fifth and seventh place of the AL West. It would be August 15th when the ballclub pulled itself up to fourth place for one day at 48-65 and 24 games behind the division leader. They finished the campaign 17-30...Freddie Patek, 5' 5" tall and 150 lbs, socked three home runs June 20th in Boston. In a bid for homer #4, Red Sox reliever Bill Campbell struck out Patek in the ninth in a game the Angels won 20-2 with 26 hits....Jason Thompson, who was acquired in a trade with Detroit May 27th for Al Cowens, led the team with 17 homers. He drove in 70. Carney Lansford (15 HR) had the most RBI (80). Joe Rudi was second with 16 jacks. As a team, the Angels hit .265 and 106 home runs...The pitching staff ended the year second-to-last in the A. L. with a 4.52 ERA. Frank Tanana and reliever Mark Clear tied for the staff lead in wins (11). Tanana posted the most strikeouts (113). Clear followed with 105 K's.
