Don Zimmer, the Red Sox skipper since the middle of the 1976 season, was relieved of his duties with five games remaining and a record of 82-73. Hitting coach and beloved star Johnny Pesky was named the interim manager for the rest of the schedule. Zimmer ended his five years in the Bosox dugout with a 411-304 record (.575) and three 90-plus win seasons...Boston's offense was potent: .283 team BA and 162 home runs, both marks third the A. L. The pitching couldn't measure up with a final 4.38 ERA, 11th in the league...Tony Perez, 38, signed as a free-agent in November '79, paced the Red Sox with his 25 homers and 105 RBI. Jim Rice, 27, followed with 24 jacks and 86 RBI. Starting centerfielder Fred Lynn and second baseman Jerry Remy both missed considerable time on the field because of injury. Lynn hit for the "cycle" May 13th at Fenway off three Twins pitchers. Dave Stapleton stepped into Remy's spot and finished second in Rookie of the Year voting. His BA average was the best among the regulars...Dennis Eckersley, 27, was the leader of the mound corps with 12 wins, 121 strikeouts, and 8 complete games. Bob Stanley, who spent some time as a starter, was a 10-game winner. The staff's 43 saves were the second most in the A. L.
