Bob Horner (35 homers, 89 RBI) and Dale Murphy (33 homers, 89 RBI) were the team leaders on offense. Murphy topped the Braves with 98 runs scored; Horner scored 81 times. Newcomer Chris Chambliss, a slick-fielding first baseman who was once coached by Bobby Cox on the Yankees, hit 18 homers, led the ball club with 170 base hits, drove in seventy-two, and scored 83 runs. Gary Matthews added 17 dingers and drove home seventy-five. The Braves went on to hit .250 for the season and 144 home runs...Phil Niekro's 15 wins, 176 strikeouts, and eleven complete games led the pitching staff. Niekro also became the only National League pitcher in history to lead the league in LOSSES for four consecutive seasons. ("Knucksie" was also inducted into baseball's Hall of Fame in 1997. Despite his record for futility, he was one of the game's best pitchers for an extended period of time--24 years--who found himself on some very mediocre ball clubs. He won 318 games in his career with a 3.35 ERA.) On the positive side, Doyle Alexander was 14-11 for the season while Tommy Boggs went twelve and nine in wins/losses. Rick Matula won eleven games; lefty Larry McWilliams was a nine-game winner. The staff posted a 3.77 ERA...The ball club was beginning to move up in the standings after finishing only eleven games in back of NL West champ Houston. The Astros won the season series, 11-7, but the Braves beat the Dodgers, 11-7, and the Giants 11-6 in their matchups. They were manhandled by the Reds, 16-2.
