At the beginning of the last weekend of the season, the Dodgers were trailing the Astros by two full games as Houston arrived at Dodger Stadium to determine the NL West Champion. In the bottom of the 10th inning on Friday night, Joe Ferguson hit a walk-off home run to beat the Astros, 3-2. On Saturday afternoon, the Dodgers beat Nolan Ryan, 2-1, leading to another Dodger victory on Sunday, 4-3, to place L. A. in a virtual tie with the Astros after Game 162. The two combatants were forced to play a one-game play-off in Los Angeles, Monday afternoon, October 6th, for the division crown and to move on to the NLCS. By the bottom of the fourth, the Dodgers trailed 7-0, but could only answer Houston knuckleballer Joe Niekro with a lone run in the bottom of the inning of a 7-1 loss. The Dodgers' six hits in the game were all singles. They left eight on-base over nine innings and committed two crucial errors in the first inning...Steve Garvey led the N. L. (6th in the majors) with 200 base hits for the year. He was tenth in the big leagues after driving in 106 runs. "Dusty" Baker (97 RBI) led the ballclub with 29 jacks followed by Ron Cey's 28 and Garvey's 26. The Dodgers topped the league with 148 homers and finished fourth with a .263 BA...Jerry Reuss was fourth in the majors in ERA and led the pitching staff with 18 wins, 10 complete games, and 6 shutouts. Bob Welch won 14, dropped 9 and led the staff with 141 strikeouts. Burt Hooton was a 14-game winner as well while Don Sutton won 13 games. Sutton ended the year with the lowest ERA in the majors and lowest WHIP for starters (0.989). Reuss finished second with a 1.016 WHIP. The staff was ranked second in ERA (3.11) among National League teams... Fernando Valenzuela, 19, made his first appearance on the major league scene September 15th pitching two innings versus Atlanta. He gave up a hit, struck out one (Jerry Royster) and didn't figure in the decision.
