The Expos are now proving they are serious contenders and a team to be reckoned with for the near future in the NL East after being tied or holding down first place for 80 calendar days during the season. As late as September 16th, Montreal claimed their largest division lead of 2 ½ games following a doubleheader sweep of the Mets in New York. Soon after, they slipped to second, but regained the top spot in the last week of the season by a half-game before dropping two of their last three games during the final weekend to the Phillies in Montreal. They tore through the month of June winning 19 of 28 games, including a consecutive 10-game winning streak from June 4 - 13...Gary Carter's 29 homers and 101 RBI led the team offensively. Four teammates slugged a total of 59 home runs: Andre Dawson (17), Larry Parrish (15), Warren Cromartie (14), and Rodney Scott (13). Dawson's 41 doubles tied him with the Cubs' Bill Buckner for the fourth-most in the major leagues. His 87 RBI were second on the ballclub. For the year, the Expos hit .257 and 114 homers. They were second in the league with 237 stolen bases. Ron LeFlore's league-leading stolen base total was second in the Big Show to Oakland's Rickey Henderson (100)...Steve Rogers and Bill Gullickson both won 16 ballgames to lead the pitching staff. Rogers completed 14 games, threw four shutouts, and topped the staff with 147 strikeouts. The hurlers posted a 3.48 ERA, placing them fifth in the N. L.
