The defending World Champions spent 100 days solely in first place or tied for the top spot. Their first string in that lofty status stretched from April 13th through June 7th. By the All Star break, they had dropped to third place (42-37) but only one game out. The Bucs spent two more extended stays in the top spot (or tied): July 15th through August 1st and August 10th through September 1st. As the season's last month progressed, Pittsburgh agonizingly fell out of the race. They won only three out of nine meetings combined versus the competing Phillies and Expos and wrapped up September 13-18 overall and eight games out... Omar Moreno, one of the elite base stealers in the game, finished third to the A's Rickey Henderson (100) and second in the N. L. to the Expos Ron LeFlore (97). Moreno tied for third in the big leagues in triples. The mercurial centerfielder led his team with 168 base hits and 87 runs scored. Mike Easler cracked the most homers (21) while Dave Parker compiled the most RBI (79). The ballclub hit .266 and 116 home runs for the year... Jim Bibby's 19 wins placed him third in the league. Bert Blyleven (8-13 W/L) topped the staff with 168 strikeouts. Bibby posted 144. John Candelaria (11-14) completed seven ballgames. The staff ERA ended the year at 3.58, sixth best in the league.
