Coach Johnny Goryl replaced Gene Mauch as the Twins manager, August 25th. In a little more than 4 ½ seasons as skipper, Mauch posted a 378-394 record (.490), including a mark of 54-71 before his dismissal. In late 1981, "The Little General" would begin to lay the groundwork for future success managing the Angels. Goryl (23-13), would be the Twins field leader for the first 37 games of the '81 season...The ballclub ended the year in the lower half of the league with a .265 team BA and 99 home runs. John Castino and Roy Smalley, Jr. led the team with 13 and 12 homers, respectively. Castino had the most RBI (64); Smalley was next with 63. Ken Landreaux set a team record with a 31-game hitting streak. He also tripled three times in a game against the Rangers, July 3rd, tying an A. L. record. On September 18th in Milwaukee, Gary Ward hit for the cycle in the first game of a twin-bill, the sixth Twin to complete that feat...Jerry Koosman, 37, won 16 games and struck out 149 to lead the pitching corps. Geoff Zahn, 34, won 14 ballgames and led the group with 13 complete games. The staff's ERA was 3.93.
