The M's third season got off to a promising start: 5-4 on April 12th and just two games out of first. It didn't take long for the bottom to fall out as the ball club agonized through an 11-game losing skein from April 13 - 26. After the year's first month, Seattle was 8-15, in last place of the AL West and seven games out. The '79 All Star Game was played on the M's home turf, The Kingdome, July 17th, but by that time they were 15 1/2 games behind the division leader at 40-54 and in sixth place. The deficit would be as many as 21 1/2 games on September 25th...Seattle hit a composite .269 (eighth in the league) and 132 home runs, good for ninth. Designated hitter Willie Horton socked the most homers (29), drove in the most runs (106), and accumulated the most base hits (180). He appeared in all 162 games as well as Ruppert Jones who knocked out 21 home runs, drove home 78, and led the team with 106 runs scored. Bruce Bochte (16 HRs) collected 100 RBI and topped the M's with 38 doubles. Dan Meyer added 20 dingers. Accomplished base stealer Julio Cruz, one of the fastest men in the game, finished fifth in the majors (third in the A. L.) in stolen bases. He was successful in a little over 84 percent of his attempts...The pitching staff ended the year with a 4.58 ERA, twelfth in the league. Mike Parrott was the leader with 14 wins, 13 complete games, and 127 strikeouts. Rick Honeycutt was an 11-game winner; Floyd Bannister won ten and punched out 115 batters...The M's scored 711 runs and allowed 820...Bochte was the only Mariners member of the All Star squad.
