Royal Ramblings: Kansas City's run of three straight AL West crowns ended with a three-game finish behind division kingpin California. Manager "Whitey" Herzog was fired after the season likely because he never got the ballclub to the World Series--thanks to the Yankees beating them in the ALCS in '76, '77, and '78. In his approximate 4 1/2 years as the Royals skipper, Herzog put together an impressive won/lost record: 410-304, a .574 winning percentage. He never finished worse than second in K. C...This ballclub could hit with the best and stole a ton of bases (.282 BA, 2nd in the A. L.; 207 steals, 1st; 79 triples, 1st; 1,596 base hits, 1st; and 851 runs, 2nd). Willie Wilson was the major league stolen base champion. George Brett ended the year 4th in the big leagues in batting average and finished with the most extra-base hits (25...42 2B, 20 3B, 23 HR). Brett topped the majors in triples and base hits (212); he was second with 119 runs scored. Darrell Porter had 20 jacks, 10 triples, and 112 RBI while leading the bigs with 121 walks. Brett knocked in 107 runs...The pitching staff ended the season 10th in the league with a 4.45 ERA. Paul Splittorff was the staff leader in wins (15). Dennis Leonard won 14 games and topped the hurlers with 126 K's, 12 complete games, and 5 shutouts. Larry Gura tallied 13 victories...Dan Marino (4th round, 99th overall) and John Elway (14th round, 463rd) were Royals selections in baseball's '79 Amateur Draft.
