The Rangers were well in the hunt for a division championship right up until the second week of August when they slipped to third place August 7th following a doubleheader loss to the Tigers in Detroit. Texas enjoyed some time in first in early April and again from June 27th through July 4th, mostly tied for the top spot. They were a disappointing 25-28 from August 7th to season's end, but finished just five games in back of AL West champ California. They played .500 baseball (34-34) versus division opponents...The Rangers ended the year fifth in team batting average (.278) and seventh in home runs (140). Pat Putnam, "Buddy" Bell, and Richie Zisk all drilled 18 homers to lead the ball club. Bell was the high man with 200 base hits and 101 RBI. He garnered a Gold Glove as well as catcher Jim Sundberg. "Bump" Wills tallied the most runs scored (90). Bell scored 89 times. Both Al Oliver and John Ellis smacked 12 dingers...The pitching staff turned in a solid 3.86 ERA, third in the American League. Steve Comer was the big winner with seventeen; thirty-six-year-old Fergie Jenkins was good for sixteen. Jenkins included the most strikeouts (164) and complete games (10) to his usually impressive lot. "Doc" Medich added ten victories. The relief corps' 42 saves led the league.
