The Braves opened the new season and played its first game of a new era at Atlanta-Fulton County Stadium, April 12th. A crowd over 50,000 welcomed the new home "nine" and witnessed Tony Cloninger, a 25-game winner in 1965, pitch a complete game but lose 3-2 in 13 innings...Felipe Alou, 31, was the major league-leader with 218 base hits and tied Brooks Robinson in runs scored (122). He finished fifth in N. L. MVP voting and led the league with 355 total bases. In the prime of his career, Alou's 31 jacks were third on the Braves to Henry Aaron's league-high 44. Aaron, 32, drove home 127 runs, the most in the big leagues. Joe Torre, 25, slammed 36 home runs while driving home 101. Mack Jones added 23 homers to Atlanta's league-high total of 207. They were second with a .263 BA...The pitching staff reported a 3.68 ERA and two 14-game winners: Cloninger and Ken Johnson. Cloninger whiffed 178 batters, the most on the pitching staff...In his fourth year as skipper, Bobby Bragan was fired August 7th with the Braves in seventh place, 12 1/2 games out at 52-59.
