The Angels finally moved into their new permanent home, Anaheim Stadium, after playing the team's first five years in other venues (primarily Dodger Stadium). They led the American League in attendance at just over 1.4 million for the season...California finished 18 games in back of the A.L. champion Orioles who won twelve of eighteen games during their season series...Joe Adcock, who platooned at first base, led the Angels with 18 homers. Bobby Knoop topped the ball club with 72 runs batted in. He also stroked 18 doubles, 11 triples and 17 home runs. Rick Reichardt and Jose Cardenal both hit 16 dingers. The latter led the team with 155 base hits. Jim Fregosi had a team high 78 runs scored and was second with 67 RBI. The Angels shortstop popped 13 home runs for the season. Their .232 team batting average was ninth in the A.L. while their 122 home runs placed them eighth...George Brunet led the pitching staff with 13 wins. Dean Chance was 12-17 with a staff leading 180 strikeouts and eleven complete games. Brunet whiffed 148 batters. The staff ERA, 3.56, was good for sixth in the league. Their 40 saves ranked them third.
