Managers' records: Dressen (16-10); Swift (32-25); Skaff (40-39). For the second time in two years, Tiger skipper Chuck Dressen was stricken with a heart attack May 16th and would not return to the dugout the rest of the season. He would pass away in hospital August 10th. His successor, Bob Swift, took ill during the July All Star recess and was found to have lung cancer after being admitted to hospital and was forced to relieve the reigns of the ballclub to coach Frank Skaff. Swift would later pass as well on October 17th...The Tigers played solid ball in the season's first half, reaching the All Star break with a 48-35 record and second place in the standings eight games behind the leader..."Stormin' Norman" Cash blasted 32 home runs to lead the team and was second to Willie Horton with 93 RBI. Horton hit 27 jacks and drove home 100. Cash also had the most base hits (168) and runs scored (98). Al Kaline added 29 homers and 88 RBI. Dick McAuliffe was good for 23 home runs. Detroit sluggers would lead the A. L. in home runs with 179 and were second with a .251 team BA...Twenty-two-year-old Denny McLain led the mound corps with a 20-14 W/L record, 14 complete games, and 192 strikeouts. Mickey Lolich was an even 14-14 and whiffed 173 batters. Earl Wilson, acquired from Boston June 14th, was 13-6 as a Tiger and posted 133 Ks. His addition was the final chip setting up Detroit for a run at the pennant in '67 and a World Series appearance in '68. The staff ERA (3.85) was ninth-best in the league.
