The 1966 season was the Giants’ ninth in San Francisco since departing New York after the ‘57 campaign. They finished just 1½ games behind the arch-rival Dodgers for the N. L. pennant. The two long-time foes split their season series, 9-9...One of the year’s big highlights was the trade of the “Baby Bull,” Orlando Cepeda, to the Cardinals on May 8th for pitcher Ray Sadecki...Thirty-five year old Willie Mays topped the ball club with 37 homers, 103 RBI, 99 runs scored, and 29 doubles. “Stretch” McCovey was right behind with his 36 round-trippers and 96 runs batted in. Slugger Jim Ray Hart popped 33 dingers and led the team in base hits (165). For the year, the Giants hit .248 at the plate and 181 home runs, the latter second in the league...Between them, Juan Marichal and Gaylord Perry won 46 games--Marichal (25) and Perry (21). Marichal led the pitching staff with 25 complete games and 222 strikeouts. He and Bobby Bolin both posted four shutouts. Giant hurlers finished third in the N.L. in ERA (3.24) and first with 52 complete games. Their 973 punch outs placed them third in the league...At wind-swept, cold and damp Candlestick Park, the Giants were fifth in the Senior Circuit in attendance with just over 1.6 million fans matriculating through the ballpark’s turnstiles.
