Braves batters went on the warpath the entire 60-game schedule while leading the major leagues with the most hits (556), doubles (130), runs batted in (338), on-base percentage (.349), and OPS (.832). The Dodgers and Braves tied for the big league-high in slugging percentage (.483). They finished second with a .268 team batting average in the National League. League MVP Freddie Freeman ended the year among major league leaders in the most important batting categories: batting average (3rd, .341); on-base pct., slugging avg., and OPS (all 2nd: .462, .640, 1.102, respectively); runs scored (1st, 51); doubles (1st, 23); RBI (3rd, 53); and walks (4th, 45). Teammate Marcell Ozuna finished third with 18 homers and second with 56 RBI. He wound up right behind Freeman in batting average. Adam Duvall blasted 16 homers while Ronald Acuna, Jr. connected for 14 and Freeman 13...Number One starter Max Fried was tied with three others for third place in the majors with seven wins. Fried did not lose a ballgame and led the Braves pitching staff with 50 strikeouts. Ian Anderson, 22, won three games and totaled 41 K's. The staff finished seventh in the N. L. in ERA (4.41)...After clinching their third consecutive NL East crown, the Braves swept through the Reds, 2-0, in a best-of-three Wild Card Series and moved on to sweep the Marlins, 3-0, in their best-of-five NLDS match-up. Atlanta jumped out to a 3-1 NLCS advantage before the powerful Dodgers came back to win the last three and the N. L. pennant, ending a tumultuous year dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic and required protocols. Freeman hit .360, two homers, and drove home six runs.
