Call it what you will, the "Brew Crew" barely sneaked into the post-season through the back-door as the National League's eighth and final seed. They captured a play-off spot for the third straight season (a franchise first) by edging out the Giants (who also finished 29-31) with a better record versus division opponents: Brewers (19-21), San Francisco (18-22). Their time in the post-season was short-lived. The Dodgers punched them out winning two games of a best-of-three Wild Card round at Dodger Stadium. Milwaukee was outscored, 7-2...Twenty-three-year-old Keston Hiura appeared in 59 of those games and led the ball club in home runs (13) and RBI (32). Christian Yelich, whom the Brewers signed to a nine-year \$215 million contract extension in March, apparently was greatly affected by the long layoff between the Spring Training shutdown and the start of the regular schedule. The former N. L. MVP (2018) and batting champion (2018, 2019) hit 12 jacks to go with 22 RBI but barely hit over .200 in 58 games played. Lorenzo Cain opted out of the 2020 season August 1st due to the COVID-19 pandemic. For the year, the team hit .223 and 75 homers...The pitching staff, with a respectable 4.16 ERA, was led by three four-game winners: starters Corbin Burnes and Brett Anderson and reliever Devin Williams who posted 17.67 strikeouts/9 innings with his 53 K's. Starter Brandon Woodruff logged the staff's most strikeouts (91) and ended the season with a 0.991 WHIP. Josh Hader allowed eight hits and struck out 31.
