The A's hit an uninspiring .225 at the plate for the season, but the pitching staff came through in fine fashion to keep the team in contention--and eventual first place finish--with a flashy 3.77 ERA, very good in this era of cheap home runs and elevated number of strikeouts...The five primary A's starters posted a combined 21 wins. Mike Fiers won six ballgames and Chris Bassitt five as leaders of the staff. Bassitt ended the season with the sixth lowest ERA among all big league pitchers (2.29). Sean Manaea accounted for four victories while Frankie Montas (3-5 W/L) topped the staff with 60 strikeouts. Eight relievers who pitched at least 14 innings had an exceptional composite 2.09 earned run average over the 60-game schedule delayed by the COVID-19 pandemic...Despite a batting average under .200, Matt Olson slugged 14 home runs and drove home 42 to pace the A's. Matt Chapman added 10 jacks and finished tied with Ramon Laureano at 25 RBI apiece...Oakland faced-off against the White Sox in a best-of-three Wild Card series and were outhit by the Sox .277 to .194 as well as out-homered six to five. Chicago won Game One, but the A's racked-up five runs in the first four innings and held on for a 5-3 win in Game Two. Oakland broke a 4-4 tie in the bottom of the fifth in Game Three after scoring two runs. Five relievers allowed only two hits the rest of the way and zero runs in the last four frames for a 6-4 victory...The A's offense perked up in a best-of-five NLDS versus the Astros. Houston hit .322 to the Athletics .269; the two ball clubs both clobbered 12 jacks and combined for 55 runs. The Astros pitching staff put up an ERA over 5.00; the A's ended with an ERA over 7.00. Oakland won Game Three by a 9-7 score; however, Houston raked for 10 runs in Game One and 11 more in the fourth and final game, both victories for the Astros to take the series three games to one...Marcus Semien hit .533 in the series along with one home run. Tommy La Stella finished with a .313 BA, a double and a home run. Chad Pinder popped two homers, drove home five and hit .308.
