Ron Roenicke was named the Bosox skipper following the dismissal and one-year suspension of Alex Cora for his alleged part in sign-stealing while with Houston's coaching staff. It proved to be a long 60-game season (if one could call it that) for Roenicke and his charges. The starting pitching, a mere shell of its one-time prominence, was largely filled by unknown quantities. The best-known of the group, Nathan Eovaldi, back from an injury-plagued 2019 season, led the staff with four wins and 52 strikeouts. Starter Martin Perez counted three victories while 24-year-old Tanner Houck celebrated three wins in his three starting assignments. Overall, the staff ERA was a pitiful 5.58...On the flip side, the Red Sox led the American League in batting average (.265) and doubles (118)--all this despite the absence of the beloved "Mookie" Betts. Boston hit 81 home runs with Xander Bogaerts and Rafael Devers both blasting 11. Devers put up the most RBI (43). Youngster Bobby Dalbec, 25, debuted August 30<sup>th</sup> and added 8 jacks to the team total. Alex Verdugo, acquired from the Dodgers in a trade involving Betts during the winter, socked six home runs and led the team in base hits (62). He tied for the team lead with 36 runs scored. With the uninspiring, shortened season brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic behind them, Red Sox brass decided to bring Cora back into the fold as field boss for the 2021 campaign.
