Season Number 151 in Reds franchise history was shortened to 60 games by the COVID-19 pandemic, but not before the ball club completed a handful of free agent signings to remake the team on the field. In December 2019, Mike Moustakas was welcomed aboard from Kansas City after inking a 4-year pact for \$64 million. Thirty-two-year-old Shogo Akiyama, a veteran of Japanese baseball and the Reds first ballplayer from the island country, joined the team with a 3-year \$21 million contract. The front office also resigned Number One starter Trevor Bauer for one year at \$17.5 million and homegrown Michael Lorenzen for one year at \$3.725 million. The Reds offense finished the season with a .212 BA, the lowest recorded in the big leagues since the 1910 Chicago White Sox (.211). They were fourth in the N. L. with 90 home runs led by Eugenio Suarez (15), Nicholas Castellanos (14), Jesse Winker (12), and Joey Votto (11). The 36-year-old Votto dealt with a grueling season in the batter's box. Suarez drove in the most runs (38). The league Cy Young Award recipient, Bauer finished among the top three in the big leagues in three major categories: ERA; strikeouts (100, 12.329 per 9 inn.); and fewest hits allowed per 9 innings (5.055). Bauer and Sonny Gray led the pitching corps at five wins apiece. Luis Castillo won four ballgames and whiffed 89 batters. The staff was second in the league in ERA, a tidy 3.84. The Redlegs qualified for an expanded post-season for the first time since 2013 and a chance to battle the Atlanta Braves in a best-of-three Wild Card Series. The Braves allowed the Reds zero runs and only 13 hits for a .169 BA. Bauer allowed no runs and two hits through 7.3 innings pitched in Game One. Atlanta won the game in 13 innings, 1-0. The Braves took Game Two, 5-0, and the series two games to none.
