Like every other major league team, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Rays played a 60-game schedule and won enough ballgames to enter the playoffs for the second straight season. Tampa Bay took over the top spot of the AL East for good on August 22nd and won the division title by seven games over the Yankees. From August 22nd on, the Rays posted a record of 22-10 (.688) while the Yanks were 17-18 to end the regular season. The Rays dominated New York in their regular season series, 8-2. Playing under the roof of Tropicana Field, Tampa swept Toronto in a best-of-three wild card series, 2-0, then at neutral site Petco Park in San Diego, the Yankees and Rays split the first four contests of a best-of-five ALDS before Tampa triumphed in the finale to take the series, 3-2. The Rays took a commanding 3-0 lead in the ALCS over the Astros, but the proud ball club from Houston staved off elimination by winning the next three games. In the decisive Game Seven, Tampa jumped out to a 4-0 advantage after six innings, allowed the Astros two runs in the eighth, then held on to win 4-2. Houston outhit the Rays in the series .260 to .201 while Tampa swatted eleven home runs to the Astros nine. The difference maker was series MVP Randy Arozarena's four timely home runs. The Rays faced the Dodgers in the 2020 World Series--the team's second since 2008--and managed to keep pace with a highly potent Los Angeles ball club after the two foes split the first four games. The Dodgers won Games Five and Six, outhitting Tampa .251 to .216 and outscoring the Rays 32-22 for the six games to win the Fall Classic. Ace Tyler Glasnow was 0-2 allowing 10 earned runs in 9 1/3 innings. He struck out fifteen and walked nine...During the regular season, Brandon Lowe led the Rays with 14 homers and 37 RBI. Former Cardinal Arozarena clubbed seven home runs in 23 games played...Glasnow finished 5-1 with 91 K's; Blake Snell went 4-2 with 63 strikeouts, while Josh Fleming was undefeated at 5-0. Reliever Pete Fairbanks' six wins were the most on the pitching staff. Closer Nick Anderson whiffed 26 opposing batters, gave up one earned run and allowed five hits.
