The 2020 season is one many fans would like to forget: The surreal experience of an abbreviated 60-game season (which commenced July 24<sup>th</sup>), empty ballparks due to COVID-19 pandemic protocols, the Mets release of the manager intended to replace the fired Mickey Callaway (Carlos Beltran to a distasteful sign-stealing controversy), the hiring of former quality control coach Luis Rojas to be the new skipper, Yoenis Cespedes walking out on the team in the season's first ten days, the failure of the Mets to make the playoffs after early predictions to be a contender, and the return of former Mets executive Sandy Alderson to the organization following the Wilpon's sale of the team to billionaire Steven A. Cohen. They carried on but were eliminated from contention on September 26<sup>th</sup> and ended the campaign the fourth straight year out of the post-season...2019 Rookie of the Year Pete Alonso struggled at the plate, but still led the team with 16 home runs. Dominic Smith really shined with his potent bat--300-plus BA, 10 homers and team-high 42 RBI--as well as at first base while Alonso spent some time as DH. Robbie Cano bounced back solidly, hitting over .300 and clubbing 10 home runs. One could say Michael Conforto personally had his best season at the plate by hitting well over .300 most of the year. Rookie Andres Gimenez showed he belonged with the big club, demonstrating great speed and outstanding fielding abilities. He essentially took over the shortstop job from Amed Rosario...The pitching staff received another of Jacob deGrom's superlative seasons which included 104 strikeouts along with a 0.956 WHIP. He won four ballgames. Edwin Diaz was a pleasant surprise and produced like the pitcher the Mets had expected since his arrival from Seattle. He punched out 50 opposing hitters and finished with an ERA under 2.00. Steven Matz had 36 K's, but ended the year without a victory and an alarmingly inflated ERA. Young lefty David Peterson, 24, impressed everyone with a staff-high 6 wins, 40 strikeouts, and only 24 walks.
