At the start of Spring Training, the Nats were missing vital cog Anthony Rendon who had signed a free-agent contract with the Angels during the off-season. Ryan Zimmerman participated in the spring workouts but then opted out of the regular season June 29th after the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. New arrival Eric Thames stepped in to Zim's spot at first base and contributed three home runs and twelve RBI in 41 games. Pitcher Stephen Strasburg, an 18-game winner and World Series MVP in 2019, opted out of his contract and declared himself a free-agent in the off-season. Nationals brass offered him a record (at that time) pact to coax him back to Washington, an agreement Strasburg signed for \$245 million over seven years in December 2019. The gifted pitcher opened the 60-game season on the injured list, then returned August 9th for his first start. In his second game, Strasburg pitched to the first three batters before leaving the game, finding himself on the injured list once more with nerve problems in the wrist of his pitching hand...Max Scherzer, dealing with a tender hamstring ailment, was not as dominating each game as one is accustomed to seeing; however, he led the pitching staff with five wins and 92 K's...Twenty-one-year-old Juan Soto was the leader at the plate with 13 jacks. Trea Turner tallied the most RBI (41) and drilled 12 home runs. Soto finished with 37 RBI...The defending World Champions never got untracked and by the end of August were well out of the race for the playoffs. A 9-16 record that month set the tone for the year.
