It's a shame the 2020 season was nearly wiped out by the COVID-19 pandemic, but delaying the start of the campaign was in everyone's best interests. Likewise, this 131st edition of the Dodgers may have been the best of any squad in the modern era. The ball club came sprinting out of the gate winning 30 of their first 40 games of a 60-game schedule, clinching their eighth straight NL West title after a 7-2 win over the A's at Dodger Stadium, September 22nd. They won four of their last five games to wrap up the division over the much-improved and highly talented Padres...Dodger batter's knocked out the most home runs in the majors (118) and scored the most runs (349). The power came through the war clubs of a healthy AJ Pollock and "Mookie" Betts, acquired along with pitcher David Price from the Red Sox in February. Pollock and Betts both accounted for 16 jacks. Corey Seager blasted 15 homers and led the team in RBI (41). Max Muncy and Cody Bellinger, the latter experiencing a tough season in the batter's box, both popped 12 home runs...The pitching staff, Number One in the N. L. with a 3.02 ERA, had Clayton Kershaw sit atop the starters with six wins and 62 strikeouts. NINE other hurlers all won three games apiece...The post-season was a true blue coming-out party as a star for Mr. Seager. His bat helped the Dodgers steamroll through the Brewers, 2-0, in a best-of-three Wild Card series and then the upstart Padres in their best-of-five NLDS, 3-0. Seager started the playoffs 5 for 18 with two doubles, a homer and 4 RBI. In the NLCS versus the Braves, the Dodgers were down three games to one before outscoring Atlanta a combined 14-7 in the last three contests to win their 24th N. L. pennant. Seager hit .310 with five home runs and eleven RBI over the seven games...With their third trip to the Fall Classic in four years, the Dodgers got into a dogfight with the Tampa Bay Rays, the teams splitting the first four games. Los Angeles won the last two for the franchise's sixth World Series crown since moving to L. A. from Brooklyn and the first since 1988...Seager capped his fabulous post-season with the NLCS AND World Series MVP awards. He hit .400 in the Fall Classic and two homers. He scored seven times and picked-up five RBI.
