The Padres new skipper, 40-year-old Jayce Tingler, was used to being a winner in the minor leagues. After his playing career ended in 2007, he managed in the low minors, finishing FIRST each year from 2008 through 2010. Highly regarded in the Texas organization as a manager, coach, and administrator, he was named the Padres bench boss in October 2019. If only COVID-19 hadn't botched-up the 2020 season. Tingler's ball club reached the post-season, but not after reaching second place of the NL West on August 19<sup>th</sup> and finishing that month, thereafter, 9-3. September saw the team go 15-8 to end the 60-game schedule six games behind the division champion Dodgers, but good enough to claim a Wild Card spot for an expanded post-season. San Diego clipped the wings of the Cardinals, 2-1, in a best-of-three Wild Card set in order to stand face-to-face with the team wearing Dodger Blue. The Padres bubble burst as they were outscored in their NLDS confrontation 23-9 and outhit .287 to .182, losing the best-of-five series to L. A., 3-0...Quickly rising to super-star status, 21-year-old Fernando Tatis, Jr. hit .318 in those six playoff games with two homers and five RBL. Tatis, Jr. hit 17 jacks during the regular season and dazzled with the glove in the field. Manny Machado re-established himself with his 16 homers and a team-high 47 RBL. Tatis knocked home 45. A rejuvenated Wil Myers added 15 home runs and 40 RBI while playing in 55 games. The Padres led the big leagues in stolen bases (55)...Zach Davies anchored the pitching staff, ending the year with seven wins and 63 strikeouts. Dinelson Lamet, 3-1 W/L, led the staff with 93 K's. Oft-injured closer Trevor Rosenthal, a revelation who was acquired from Kansas City at the trade deadline, did not allow an earned run after his arrival and averaged 15.3 K/9 innings in nine relief appearances.
