With the exception of ONE day, July 25th and a loss to put their record at 1-1, the new-look Cubs under rookie skipper/former Cub David Ross maintained first place of the NL Central. Their largest lead was 5 ½ games on September 18th. Eight days later they claimed the division title for the first time since 2017. The highlight of the year was Alec Mills’ no-hitter of the Brewers in Milwaukee, September 13th. During the 16th no-no in franchise history, Mills struck out five and walked three, a game the Cubbies blasted the Brewers, 12-0...In the batter’s box, Cubs’ hitters struggled as a unit for most of the season. Their .220 team BA ranked them 13th while 74 home runs placed them 9th. Ian Happ racked-up the most homers (12) and tallied 28 RBI. Anthony Rizzo and Kyle Schwarber both cracked 11 jacks. David Bote (7 home runs) led the team with 29 RBI...The Cubs’ six primary starting pitchers compiled a record of 25-19. Yu Darvish, second in N. L. Cy Young Award voting, topped the pitching staff with eight victories and 93 strikeouts. Kyle Hendricks won six ballgames; Mills contributed five wins. The staff’s ERA (3.99) was fifth-best in the league...The COVID-19 pandemic resulted in a much-abbreviated 60-game schedule and expanded playoffs bracket. The Cubs, with the third seed, faced off with the upstart Miami Marlins in a best two-out-of three Wild Card match-up at Wrigley Field. Miami outscored Chicago 7-1 to take the series in two games. The Cubs hit .145 to the Marlins .203. Happ hit .500 (4 for 8) and a home run.
