Miami performed as an up-and-coming ball club after sweeping the Cubs from the playoffs in a two-out-of-three Wild Card series before returning to the holding pond at the hands of the Braves in the NLDS, 3-0...Brian Anderson led the offense with 11 homers and 38 RBI. Pablo Lopez’s six wins and 59 strikeouts paced the pitching staff...Skipper Don Mattingly became the franchise’s winningest manager when he achieved his 282<sup>nd</sup> victory on August 7<sup>th</sup>.
