The Braves remarkably won their fourth consecutive NL East Division crown despite the loss of two integral parts for most of the year. On July 10th, budding super-star Ronald Acuna, Jr. left the game with a torn ACL, sidelining him for the remainder of the campaign. He had been among major league leaders with 24 home runs at the time of his injury. He had driven in 52 runs and led MLB with 72 runs scored. June saw Marcell Ozuna placed on administrative leave following charges of domestic abuse. He was later suspended through the end of the season...Three Braves hit 30-plus homers topped by MVP candidate Austin Riley's 33. He also led the team with 107 RBI. Stellar second baseman Ozzie Albies socked 30 home runs and knocked in 106. Freddie Freeman added 31 jacks and scored 120 runs. As a team, Atlanta hit .244 and 239 homers...Max Fried and Charlie Morton anchored the pitching staff, each winning 14 ballgames. Morton led the staff with 216 K's...On August 4th, the Braves were under .500, but they went on a 34-18 rampage to finish as NL East champs...Milwaukee was dispatched in the NLDS, 3-1, leading to the tomahawking of the Dodgers from the post-season tournament in a six-game NLCS...World Series opponent Houston was bombarded with 11 home runs (three by Series MVP Jorge Soler) while Fried whiffed 12 in 11 IP to propel the Braves to their first World title since 1995.
