The Redbirds were the second qualifying Wild Card team for the post-season, finishing just 5 games behind division champ Milwaukee. St. Louis held first place early in the year, May 5 - 30. Their biggest lead was 3 ½ games on May 19<sup>th</sup>. To make the play-offs, the Cardinals zipped through a 22-7 September which included a 17-game winning streak September 11<sup>th</sup> through the 28<sup>th</sup>. Forty-year-old Adam Wainwright held off Father Time with a spectacular 17-7 W/L mark, a staff high 174 K's, and 1.057 WHIP to lead the starters...The offense featured three 30-plus home run hitters: Nolan Arenado (34), Tyler O'Neill (34), and Paul Goldschmidt (31). Arenado also drove in 105 runs while Goldschmidt was next with 99...In the Wild Card Game against the Dodgers in Los Angeles, the Cardinals scored a run in their half of the first inning, but were tied by the Dodgers in the fourth before L. A. scored two runs in the bottom of the ninth to advance. St. Louis left 11 men on base and were 0 for 11 with men in scoring position in the ballgame.
