The Bosox and Tampa Bay battled for first place of the AL East for practically the entire season, but a three-game sweep by the Rays in Tampa July 30th through August 1st settled the issue. From that point to the end of the regular schedule, the Red Sox went 29-26 while the Rays pulled away from the pack playing .643 baseball (36-20). Right on the heels of the Red Sox were the Yankees who were 36-22 from that point (August 1st) on. The regular schedule ended with Boston and New York posting identical records which aligned the two arch-rivals for a match-up in the AL Wild Card Game. At Fenway Park, the Red Sox advanced with a 6-2 win behind Number One starter Nathan Eovaldi. Boston would topple the Rays from the post-season, winning the ALDS, 3-1. The ALCS versus Houston went the Astros way, 4-2, as they outthit the Red Sox .277 to .212. Kike Hernandez (3 HR, 10 hits, .385 BA, 5 XBH) did not get enough help from his teammates. The bullpen struggled to get anyone out... Boston hit .261 and 219 home runs for the year. Their 330 doubles were the most in MLB. Rafael Devers was the team leader with his 38 jacks and 113 RBI. Southpaw Eduardo Rodriguez wracked-up 13 wins to pace the pitching staff; Eovaldi won 11 games and collected the most strikeouts (195). The staff ERA was 4.26 (7th in the AL).
