Along with the return of Tony La Russa for his second stint as skipper of the White Sox, the season produced lots of highlights capped off with a trip to the post-season...On April 14<sup>th</sup>, Carlos Rodon no-hit the Indians, allowing only one base runner in the ninth inning (a hit batter). Rookie Yermin Mercedes was an early season sensation, becoming the first player in major league history to open a new year eight for eight. “Seby” Zavala became the first player in big league history to hit his first three career home runs in the same game. La Russa passed legendary manager John McGraw for the second most wins all-time on June 6<sup>th</sup>...The pitching staff boasted six pitchers who struck out 100 or more batters. Dylan Cease, 25, won 13 games and whiffed 226 batters (12.3 per 9 innings). Rodon also won 13 times while Lucas Giolito earned 11 wins and punched out 201 opposing hitters. Liam Hendricks led the A. L. in saves (38)...As a team, the White Sox offense hit .256 and 190 homers for the year. Jose Abreu (30 HR, 117 RBI) paced the team at the plate; Yasmani Grandal blasted 23 jacks in an injury shortened campaign. Luis Robert did not have enough at bats to qualify as the MLB batting champion...Chicago claimed its first AL Central title since 2008. The Houston Astros won the match-up in the ALDS three games to one, ending the White Sox's season. Chicago outhit the Astros .291 to .288, but the pitching corps allowed nearly eight runs per game in the series. Houston scored 31 runs, the White Sox 18.
