The fan-base and the entire organization had to wonder all season long "What kind of team do we have here?" Premier seasons from NL MVP Bryce Harper (35 HR, 84 RBI, BA seventh-best in the majors); Zack Wheeler (14 wins, fifth-best ERA in the majors, 247 strikeouts, 1.008 WHIP); and the return of arguably the game's best catcher, free-agent J. T. Realmuto, should have ensured a playoff spot. The Phils WERE a competitor...and then they weren't. A .500 record at the All Star break placed them second in the NL East, four games behind. As late as August 14th, they were in the top spot by a half-game over Atlanta; however, they went 21-24 down the stretch while the eventual division champion Braves played .628 baseball (27-16)...Rhys Hoskins and Andrew McCutchen both slammed 27 homers (Cutch drove in 80 runs). Brad Miller, who clubbed three home runs in the same game, July 8th, totaled 20 home runs for the year in only 331 at bats. He also hit a walk-off grand slam, July 29th, to beat the Nationals...Aaron Nola was second to Wheeler with nine wins and 223 punch outs.
