Byron Buxton's yearly turn on the injured list was accentuated during a season he was available for only 61 games. Early in the year, a tender hamstring and then a hip-flexor muscle strain limited his playing time. Shortly after returning to the line-up, on June 21st, in a game with Cincinnati, he was hit by a pitch on his left hand while at bat, resulting in a broken bone. He was hitting an eye-popping .369 with 10 home runs and .767 OPS at that time. For the year, he went on to hit a total of 19 homers and 23 doubles in 235 at bats. He finished with a 1.005 OPS...The Twins' big boppers were second in the A. L. with 228 home runs. Jorge Polanco was the leader with 33 jacks and 98 RBI. Right behind were Miguel Sano (30 HR, 75 RBI) and Josh Donaldson (26 HR, 72 RBI in 135 games)...The pitching staff was a big let-down (4.83 ERA, second-to-last in the league). Michael Pineda had the most wins (9). Jose Berrios' 126 strikeouts held up to be the staff high despite his trade to Toronto, July 30th. He posted a 7-5 record as a Twin...The defending AL Central Division champions in 2019 and 2020 got off to a rocky start, finishing April 9-15, fourth in the division, and six games out of first. At the All Star break the ballclub was 39-50, in third place, 15 games out.
