The Bucs were 25-23 and 21-33 in the two halves of the strike-shortened '81 campaign...In April, higher-ups of the Louisiana Superdome made a serious inquiry about purchasing the Pirates franchise and moving it to New Orleans with team ownership disgruntled about their lease for Three Rivers Stadium... Team Leaders: Jason Thompson (15 HR); Dave Parker (48 RBI); Omar Moreno (120 base hits, 62 runs); Rick Rhoden (9 wins, 76 K's). Bill Madlock bested Boston's Carney Lansford by .005 of a point to win the major league batting title. Pete Rose's .325 was second to "Mad Dog" in the National League...Pirates batters hit .257 and 55 home runs while the pitching staff ended the season with a 3.56 ERA.
