A's Notes: The team drew the fewest fans (528,000+) and lost the most ball games during its 13 seasons in K. C...Eccentric, quirky, and odd-ball owner Charlie Finley installed a petting zoo for kids at Municipal Stadium and signed Negro League legend Satchel Paige, 58, to pitch in one game against Boston, September 25th. Paige reportedly was served coffee by a "nurse" in the bullpen. Nine thousand were in attendance for Paige's final game...On September 8th, during "Campy Camp Night," Bert Campaneris played ALL nine positions...When the enterprising Finley signed a young teenage phenom named Jim Hunter from Hertford, NC, Charlie felt his new protégé needed an enduring sobriquet: "Catfish." His story goes his parents tagged him with the nickname after he was seen as a child carrying a string of catfish he had caught. The future HOF debuted May 13th against the White Sox, walking one and striking out two in two innings pitched. He won eight and lost eight with two shutouts for the year...Ken Harrelson led the A's with 23 homers and 66 RBI. Campaneris had the most base hits (156) and runs scored (67). As a team, the Athletics hit .240 and 110 homers. They led the A. L. with 110 stolen bases...Both Fred Talbot and Rollie Sheldon led the pitching staff with ten wins. Diego Segui (5-15) posted the most strikeouts (119). "Catfish" Hunter, 19, collected 82 punch outs. The staff finished ninth in the league in ERA (4.24)...Managers' records: McGaha (5-21), Sullivan (54-82). Sullivan, who was the A's Triple A manager, moved to the big club May 16th, becoming the youngest skipper in the majors at thirty-four.
