The Angels played the first five months of the season listed as the Los Angeles Angels. On September 2<sup>nd</sup>, owner/entertainer Gene Autry officially renamed his team the California Angels with the ball club nearly ready to make its move to Anaheim and a new ballpark for 1966...Shortstop Jim Fregosi led the Angels with 15 home runs, 167 base hits, 64 RBI and 66 runs scored. Joe Adcock and "Wonderful Willie" Smith both cracked 14 dingers. Smith and Jose Cardenal finished tied for second with 57 runs batted in. The team hit .239 for the year and 92 home runs. They were fourth in the A.L. with 200 doubles...The Cy Young winner for 1964, Dean Chance, topped the pitching staff with a 15-10 W/L record, 164 K's and four shutouts. He walked 101 batters. Marcelino Lopez and Fred Newman both won fourteen. Southpaw George Brunet and reliever Bob Lee each posted nine victories. Brunet struck out 141 opponents. Chance and Newman both had ten complete games. The staff ERA (3.17) was fourth in the league.
