From the beginning of the season to the end of June, the Chisox were hot on the heels of the Twins. In July, the White Sox hit a speed-bump. They ended the month in fifth place, 9 ½ games out after winning only 12 of 28 games. Meanwhile, the first place Twins were streaking to a 22-9 record. Between August 14<sup>th</sup> and the 22<sup>nd</sup>, Chicago hopped back into the race reeling off a consecutive 10-game winning streak against the lowly Red Sox, Senators, and Athletics whom the Sox beat in a five game series in Kansas City at the streak's end. They were now back in second place 6 ½ games behind. The momentum they had established didn't last. They were effectively out of the race by mid-September, falling 10 ½ games in arrears as late as the 15<sup>th</sup>...The strength of the ballclub was the pitching staff. The group ended the season with a 2.99 ERA, second best in the A. L. Tommy John's fourteen wins topped the regular starters. The bullpen possessed two of the best knuckleball pitchers in the game: Eddie Fisher and 42-year-old Hoyt Wilhelm. Fisher wound up fourth in MVP voting with a league-leading 0.974 WHIP and 82 games pitched. He won 15...No less than nine White Sox batters hit double-digits in home runs. Bill Skowron and Johnny Romano both clubbed 18 jacks. Skowron, the old Yankee, had the most RBI (78)...As a team, Chicago hit .246 and 125 homers.
