Yankees Notes: A year after being beaten in their last World Series appearance until 1976, "The Bronx Bombers" have begun their slide to the lower rungs of the American League. This marked the first season since 1925 the Yankees would fail to reach .500 and not finish in the first division. (They would finish 1966 buried in last place for the first time since 1912.) Legend Yogi Berra was fired after the '64 campaign--mainly due to upper management's loss of confidence in his managing the ball club on the field and in the clubhouse--and ironically replaced him with the skipper of the World Champion Cardinals, Johnny Keane. Keane's stint was short and unsuccessful: He never connected personally with the team, and lacked any credibility with them from the start. Keane would be terminated as Yankee skipper just 20 games into the 1966 season; but, by then, the team was a rapidly aging and inferior ball club...**Team Leaders:** Tom Tresh, 26, hit 26 homers, drove in 74, collected 168 base hits, and scored 94 runs. Mickey Mantle, 33, with bad knees and all, popped 19 home runs and drove in 46. Clete Boyer and Joe Pepitone both swatted 18 dingers. The team hit 149 homers and a paltry .235...The pitching staff was fifth in the league with a 3.28 ERA. Twenty-three-year-old Mel Stottlemire, Sr. went 20-9 in W/L and completed 18 games. Old reliable "Whitey" Ford won sixteen games at thirty-six while Al Downing won twelve and led the staff with 179 strikeouts...Future star Bobby Murcer, 19, made his debut in the majors, September 8th. His first major league hit was a two-run homer, September 14th, at Washington...American League Rookie of the Year in 1957, Tony Kubek, hit his last big league homer, October 3rd, in his final game at Boston.
