The Tigers, who were second in the American League with 162 home runs and 680 runs scored, scratched and clawed their way through the season to remain close to the front-runners. After being seven games out and in fifth at the All Star break (46-36), they moved into fourth, then third, and came as close as second following a doubleheader sweep of Boston at Fenway Park, August 20th. Their deficit was eight games. They soon fell out of the race as they played around .500 baseball (20-21) from then on...The Tigers were in third and three games out on May 30th when Bob Swift (24-18) was replaced by coach Chuck Dressen. Swift was subsequently named as bench coach...Stormin' Norman" Cash ended the year among major league leaders in slugging percentage (.512) and OPS (.883). He topped the ballclub with 30 jacks. Willie Horton posted the most RBI (104) and added 29 homers. Cash collected 83 RBI while Al Kaline, limited to 399 at bats, popped 18 home runs and drove home 72. The 30-year-old Kaline swung the bat for a .859 OPS...Denny McLain, only 21, won 16 ballgames, dropped six and ended the year among the big leagues' best with 192 strikeouts as well as a walks/hits ratio per nine innings of 1.071 (7th) and hits allowed per nine innings pitched (7.107, 10th). He completed 13 games. Mickey Lolich, 24, was a 15-game winner with nine losses. The lefty struck out 226 batters (9th in MLB) and placed sixth in the majors with a strikeouts/9 innings ratio of 8.348. Hank Aguirre tallied 14 wins while Joe Sparma won 13 times...Jerry Lumpe's last name is pronounced LUMP-ee.
