Manager David Ross signed a three-year contract extension prior to the season; however, his ballclub failed to come through for him. The Cubbies missed the playoffs for the second straight year...Nico Hoerner (10 HRs, 55 RBI) led the team in hitting and confidently spent the entire season at one position. Patrick Wisdom was the home run leader with 25. Ian Happ had the second-best BA on the team as well as 17 homers and the most RBI (72). At the trade deadline, and after, Willson Contreras was rumored to be traded almost anywhere, but wound up the year as a Cub. He slammed 22 jacks and drove home 55. Twenty-seven-year old Seiya Suzuki, a nine-year veteran of Japanese baseball, was a welcome new addition, contributing 14 homers and 46 RBI...The pitching staff's 4.00 ERA placed them 10th in the N. L. with Keegan Thompson the biggest winner (10). Newcomer Marcus Stroman won six games and struck out 119. Youngster Justin Steele (4 wins) whiffed 126 batters. Kyle Hendricks's year ended in August after a MRI revealed he had suffered a right shoulder capsule tear which hadn't sufficiently healed. He first reported trouble with his throwing shoulder in June.
