Birds on the Wing: It had been 2016 since the O's had a winning season with "Buck" Showalter at the helm, but a 31-game improvement in wins over 2021 was a lot for this young ballclub to enthusiastically chirp and flap about. The Orioles listed no less than nine hitters with at least 10 and as many as 33 home runs. At the top of the pack was Anthony Santander who also led the team with 89 RBI in 152 games played. Ryan Mountcastle, settling in as the everyday first baseman, followed with 22 jacks and 85 RBI. The arrival of former #1 draft pick, 24-year-old Adley Rutschman, was an added boon to the offense. He tied Austin Hays for the team lead with 35 doubles and contributed 13 home runs, 42 RBI, as well as a second place finish in American League Rookie of the Year voting. Rutschman threw out 25 of 36 base runners attempting to steal. Fleet-footed centerfielder Cedric Mullins popped 16 homers and stole enough bases to finish third in the big leagues. Teammate Jorge Mateo was second...Veteran starter Jordan Lyles won the most games on the pitching staff (12) to go with 144 strikeouts. John Means, looking to be the heir apparent at the top of the Orioles mound corps, pitched his last game of the year on April 13th before being placed on the injured list and undergoing Tommy John surgery, May 11th...The O's high-mark for the season was 10 games over .500 on September 3rd. Their longest winning streak was 10 straight games from early into mid-July.
