Time to feed The Fish: The 30th edition of the Marlins got off to a pretty good start, going 12-8 in the month of April and gaining second place of the NL East. Soon after, the ballclub began it's usual downward trend to serve as the ultimate "spoiler", sometimes very competitive and sometimes not. However, no blame can be pointed to ace Sandy Alcantara, the unanimous National League Cy Young Award winner and the victor of 14 games. He struck out 207 batters and completed six games, the latter a highly rare occurrence in these days of stacked bullpens. Pablo Lopez faired well, too, claiming 10 wins and whiffing 174 opponents. Despite a late-August release by the ballclub, Jesus Aguilar wound up leading the Marlins with 15 home runs. Garrett Cooper, who missed a good deal of playing time due to injury, was the team leader in RBI (50). Aguilar ended with 49. The offense was also hindered with the absence of injured Jazz Chisholm, Jr., who played in only 60 games but hit 14 jacks, drove in 45 runs and posted an .860 OPS. Jon Berti was the major league base stealing champion...Manager Don Mattingly departed the scene at the end of the year as the franchise's winningest field boss: 443 wins (.430 winning percentage) over seven seasons.
