A new season, a new name, their first trip to the post-season since 2018, and the 11th AL Central Division title for Cleveland's MLB franchise. The newly minted Guardians finished fourth in league batting average (.254) and 14th in home runs (127); however, several players went to the plate with sticks of dynamite. Firstly, there's Jose Ramirez, the default team leader who's worth every cent of a new 5-year \$124 million contract extension. He topped the ballclub slugging 29 home runs and the American League with 44 doubles. One of the best hitters in baseball, he finished the season with a .514 slugging percentage (7th); an OPS of .869 (7th); runs scored (90, 8th); total bases (309, 2nd); and RBI (126, 2nd). Teammates Andres Gimenez (.837 OPS, 10th in MLB); Amed Rosario (180 hits, 3rd); and rookie Steven Kwan (.298 BA, 8th; 168 base hits, 9th; 7 triples, 3rd) all came into their own as youngsters with bright futures and Gold Glove-style play in the field everyday. Josh Naylor was second on the ballclub with 20 homers and 79 RBI. Gimenez showed some pop in his bat with 17 jacks...Ace Shane Bieber won 13 games and led the pitching staff in strikeouts (198). Twenty-four-year old Triston McKenzie was an 11-game winner with 190 K's and a 0.951 WHIP, good for fifth in the majors. Closer Emmanuel Clase earned the most saves in the big leagues (42). Cal Quantrill led the staff with 15 victories; he struck out 128. The pitching corps was fourth in the league in ERA (3.46)...On August 10th, the Guardians took sole possession of first place (they were tied for one day), stringing their lead to as many as 11 games the last day of the season. With two more teams in each league added to the playoffs, part of a new collective bargaining agreement in the Spring, Cleveland dumped Tampa Bay without much trouble (2-0, best-of-three) in a Wild Card series. The year ended in disappointment after the Yankees won the final two games of a best-of-five Division series, three games to two. The Guardians had taken two of the first three. New York out-homered Cleveland, 9-3. Rookie Kwan led the team with a .429 BA, homering once while Ramirez hit a solid .400 and a homer...Skipper Terry Francona was named the A. L. Manager of the Year.
