Phillies Phodder: When Joe Girardi was let go, June 2nd, the ballclub was a disappointing 22-29 and 12 ½ games out of first of the NL East. As bench coach Rob Thomson took over as skipper, the team immediately began to win. Thomson's Phillies won his first eight games as the boss, 16 of his first 18! Free agent Kyle Schwarber's potent bat went into the lead-off spot Opening Day--he had a blast of a year. Schwarber led the team in RBI (94) while finishing second in the majors with 46 home runs...The pitching staff was ninth in the league with a 3.97 ERA. Hurlers Aaron Nola and Zack Wheeler shined bright during the summer. Nola won 11 ballgames, racking up MLB's fourth highest strikeout total (235). Wheeler led the staff with 12 victories. He punched out 163...The Pightin's barely clinched one of four wildcard spots as part of an expanded playoffs. Hardly anyone foresaw this team going deep in the post-season. The Phils surprised the Cardinals, 2-0, in one of two Wildcard series; knocked off the defending champion Braves, 3-1, in an NLDS; and ambushed the Padres, 4-1, in the NLCS...Huge underdogs to the Astros heading into the World Series, Philly jumped out to a 2-1 lead after three games. Houston's combined no-hitter by a quartet of Astros hurlers in Game Four pivoted the Series eventual outcome. The Phillies offense vanished. They scored three runs in the final two games as Houston won the Series, 4-2...Bryce Harper, with a banged-up elbow and utilized as the designated hitter during the post-season, hit .349 with 6 homers and 13 RBI. He was named NLCS MVP. In 99 games, he had slugged 18 homers and drove home 65.
