If the Padres 2021 season had been presented as a Broadway play, it would have been considered a flop. In 2022, the troupe from San Diego brought in some new, fresh talent: a veteran and proven skipper, Bob Melvin, and at the trade deadline young, stellar outfielder Juan Soto from Washington as well as his Nationals teammate, Josh Bell, and closer Josh Hader from the Brewers. The Padres season got off to a very good start, showing they could display the right ensemble talented enough to tie the Dodgers for first place of the NL West as late as June 22<sup>nd</sup>. A loss to the Phillies the following day dropped them to second, leaving them the rest of the summer to watch the Dodgers "pack the house" and run away with the division title. San Diego sneaked into the playoffs as the league's second of three Wild Card teams to qualify for the post-season...Appearing in one of two Wild Card series, the Padres eliminated the hapless Mets, 2-1, (best-of-three), then toppled the 111-win Dodger ballclub, 3-1, in a best-of-five Division series. The NLCS against the Phillies went five games before the Phils closed the curtains for the Padres season after taking the last three games in Philadelphia, outscoring San Diego, 18-11...Manny Machado improved his offensive performance from 2021 in a big way, finishing among big league leaders with 32 home runs, 102 RBI, 100 runs scored, 37 doubles and an OPS of .898. Both Jake Cronenworth and Trent Grisham followed Machado as each hit 17 homers. In a Padres uniform, the twenty-three-year old Soto swatted six jacks and walked 44 times in 52 games. Yu Darvish enjoyed an excellent, sometimes dominating campaign by leading the Padres pitching staff with 16 wins, 197 strikeouts and a .950 WHIP. He walked a measly 1.711 batters per nine innings pitched. Joe Musgrove won 10 ballgames and struck out 184 opponents. Blake Snell whiffed 171 batters and Hader contributed seven saves over 19 appearances...Head-to-head versus division opponents, the Padres were 41-35.
