By defeating the Yankees, 1-0, August 6<sup>th</sup>, the Redbirds moved into first place of the NL Central Division, going on to win their 12<sup>th</sup> division title since 1993. The Phillies ended their post-season dreams after winning two games of a best-of-three Wild Card series, 2-0...However, this was a season to celebrate the conclusion of two certain Hall of Fame careers for Yadier Molina and Albert Pujols. The latter returned to the Cardinals for his last year in tow with 679 career home runs. Playing on a regular basis in the season's second half, he went on a homer binge, hitting 9 jacks in September to finish with a career 703 to place him fourth on the All time list. A Cardinal for 12 seasons, Pujols hit 469 homers, hit .326, and won three MVP awards as well as Rookie of the Year in 2001. "Yadi" Molina left a great legacy, too, after playing his entire career with St. Louis (19 years) while hitting 176 home runs, driving in 1,022 runs, and garnering nine Gold Gloves, including four Platinum. He batted .277. Molina and pitcher Adam Wainwright were the starting battery in 325 total games, a major league record...National League MVP Paul Goldschmidt was the home run and RBI leader on the team (35, 115). His BA was third best in the big leagues. In addition, "Goldy" finished fourth for OBP, Slugging Percentage, and OPS: a slash of .404/.578/.981. Nolan Arenado walloped 30 jacks to go with 103 RBL...The pitching staff posted a tidy 3.79 ERA with Miles Mikolas and Wainwright the winningest of the bunch, 12 and 11, respectively.
